

Key vocabulary		
<u>Alms-houses</u>	Houses provided by poor people, usually by a rich person or charity	
<u>Chamberlain</u>	The person in charge of a large household	
Congregation	All the people attending a Christian or Jewish religious service	
<u>Courtiers</u>	Men who serve the Monarchs	
<u>Reformation</u>	A Christian movement to reform the Roman Catholic church which led to the founding of the Protestant religion.	
<u>Gibbet</u>	A frame in which the bodies of execution criminals were displayed	
<u>Protestant</u>	A branch of the Christian religion, founded during the Reformation. Today their are many different Protestant religions including the Church of England.
