



<u>Key vocabulary</u>	
<u>Alms-houses</u>	Houses provided by poor people, usually by a rich person or charity 
<u>Chamberlain</u>	The person in charge of a large household
<u>Congregation</u>	All the people attending a Christian or Jewish religious service
<u>Courtiers</u>	Men who serve the Monarchs
<u>Reformation</u>	A Christian movement to reform the Roman Catholic church which led to the founding of the Protestant religion.
<u>Gibbet</u>	A frame in which the bodies of execution criminals were displayed 
<u>Protestant</u>	A branch of the Christian religion, founded during the Reformation. Today there are many different Protestant religions including the Church of England.
<u>Sheath</u>	protective case for a sword, or dagger usually made of leather
<u>Stonemason</u>	A person who prepares and lays the stone needed to construct a building
<u>Treason</u>	The Act of betraying your monarch or country
